I have recently become aware of Senate Bill No. 95, an Act concerning solar easements, and providing for the creation and conveyancing thereof and the recordation and contents of the instrument relating thereto.

Would you please advise me whether this Act has become enacted as part of the law of Colorado. By further reference, it is described as Article 32.5.

We are in the process of doing research into methods of protecting owners of solar and wind energy sources from conflicting land uses by neighbours who may install structures which may impede light or air.

Would you please advise me of any similar legislation you are aware of in other jurisdictions.
