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This is a special meeting of the Halton Solid Waste Management Committee. Any groups or individuals wishing to appear as a delegation before the Committee should advise the Regional Clerk's Office at 827-2151, extension 353 or 356.

The Review of Stage 2B Report was undertaken to review the need for additional landfill capacity resulting from Regional Council's decision to pursue 100 percent landfill for the first 8 years of the 20 year planning period 1988 - 2008, i.e. to 1996, and 50 percent landfill/50 percent Energy From Waste for the remaining 12 years of the planning period to 2008. The Report reviews the multi-site versus single-site option to determine if the new capacity requires any change in our approach. The report also reviews the site selection process to determine if the six candidate sites are still appropriate for consideration in Stage 2C. The consultants considered transportation, social, and economic impacts in their review.

As indicated in Walker Wright Young Associates Stage 2B/2C Work Program forwarded to you on September 18, 1984, Regional Council will consider adopting the results of the Review of the Stage 2B Report, if there is no significant change to the single-site versus multi-site approach and the six candidate sites. If there is a significant change, a further public review period will be allowed for formal submission of comments on the Review of the Stage 2B Report.

A staff report on the Review of Stage 2B Report also will be available from the Regional Clerk's office on Friday, October 5, 1984 after 1:00 p.m.
