LONG TERM WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR THE REGIONAL
MUNICIPALITY OF HALTON
LANDFILL COMPONENT

The Regional Municipality of Halton has requested the Environmental Assessment Board to investigate the possibility of mediation in order to develop final plans for a long-term waste management system for the Regional Municipality of Halton.

The Environmental Assessment Board has appointed Michel Picher and Geoffrey Grenville-Wood to act as Fact-Finders in this matter, and to report to the Board with respect to the feasibility of resolving the issues relating to this project by negotiation between the Region and interested persons. To set this investigation in motion Messrs. Picher and Grenville-Wood will shortly be contacting interested persons to arrange meetings to explain their role and how mediation may be used.

On December 19 last, Regional Council requested me to write to each of the Area Councils asking them to consider participating in a "fact-finding" exercise by the Environmental Assessment Board to determine whether Environmental Mediation might be of assistance in resolving all or some of the issues related to the Environmental Assessment: Landfill Component, now being carried out in Halton.

At the December 19 meeting of Regional Council, Mr. Barry Smith, the Chairman of the Environmental Assessment Board, appeared before Council to make a presentation on Environmental Mediation; what it is, what it does, what it can't do, etc.

He informed Regional Council that the Ministry of the Environment had asked the Environmental Assessment Board to take charge of implementing Environmental Mediation in Ontario where opportunities existed for that purpose to resolve environmental conflicts.

The Chairman further informed Regional Council that he had been asked by the Minister of the Environment to research the possibility of Environmental Mediation being applied in the case of the Environmental Assessment for Halton's new landfill component.

To that end, the Chairman indicated that he was considering the appointment of a "Fact Finder(s)" to meet with the various parties still directly interested in the Environmental Assessment:

Landfill Component in Halton to determine if Environmental Mediation might be of some assistance in resolving the outstanding issues.

All of the Area Municipalities are, of course, directly impacted by the location and operation of a landfill component (i.e. land use, haulage and economic terms) and thus the Chairman of the Environmental Assessment Board requested that each of the Area Municipalities be contacted with respect to this matter.

Thus, this letter and request.

Regional Council, in response to the Chairman of the Board, passed a resolution, a copy of which is attached, indicating no objection to the "fact-finding" exercise, and appointing myself as the Regional contact person for the Fact Finder.

The intention of the Chairman of the Board is to decide in the next week or so whether to appoint a Fact Finder(s) and, if so, whom. I have written to each of the Area C.A.O.'s asking them to at least be the initial contact person for each of the Area Municipalities pending Area Municipal Council consideration, should the Chairman appoint a Fact Finder(s), to begin the necessary work of investigating the situation early in January, before the Council has an opportunity to consider this matter.

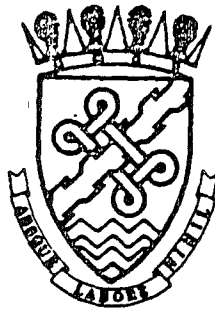
