The grant was for an initial year's subscription to an Internet service provider for a web account, and to pay a consultant to set up an initial web site, which library staff would then build on. The project was completed during the fall of this year. The Resource Library now has an account with Web Networks under the username envlib@web.net & http://web.net/~envlib. A consultant was hired to construct the initial site, which has the Library Bulletin and a number of bibliographies. Staff will continue to add to this content using the web templates which are available.

Describe the success of your project.

We are already receiving e-mail requests from people who might never have otherwise heard of us. One man, an environmental studies professor from Nipissing University, said that the library was an invaluable resource for him to either just find out about materials so he could order them for his library there, or to find out if it would be worthwhile for him to make the trip here to do some in-depth research on a topic. This grant also was an important catalyst in being able to receive \$2500 for a new computer and printer from the Law Foundation of Ontario in order to complete the work. We are currently applying for another grant to post the entire catalogue.

Any other comments or suggestions for improvements?

We are grateful for the support provided by Shell, but I feel that I must mention that I hope Shell will make efforts to improve its environmental and human rights record in Nigeria.
