THE AWARDS COMMITTEE

The White Owl Conservation Awards Committee is an independent body with sole responsibility for deciding who will receive the Awards and grants offered by the White Owl program.

This year's Awards Committee was made up of:

Robert Franson, Associate Professor of Law, University of British Columbia, Vancouver. Teaches environmental law, is chairman of the western Canadian chapter of the Sierra Club.

Roderick Hunter, Vice-President, James Richardson & Sons, Limited, Winnipeg. Mr. Hunter is a past-chairman of the Board of Regents, United College (now the University of Winnipeg) and has been a member of the University Grants Commission, Province of Manitoba, since 1967. He is President of Ducks Unlimited (Canada).

Dr. Adrian Jones, a pediatrician at the University of Alberta. Dr. Jones took part in the Canadian Task Force on Population at the Man and Resources Conference last year. He is a member of the Interdisciplinary Group on the Environment at the University of Alberta, and of the Grants Advisory Committee of the Alberta Environmental Research Trust. A climber, Dr. Jones serves on the National Conservation Committee of the Alpine Club of Canada.



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Senator Maurice Lamontagne, Ottawa. Head of the Senate Science Policy Committee and member of the Club of Rome.

Gisèle Lamoureux, a free-lance botanist-ecologist from Quebec. Ms Lamoureux is currently preparing a series of books on wild plants of Quebec for the provincial government. She teaches at the University of Quebec at Trois-Rivières and is a scientific advisor for botany studies to the Centre for Research in Environmental Sciences at the University of Quebec at Montreal.

Louis Lapierre, Professor of Biology at the University of Moncton. Director of the Conservation Council of New Brunswick, member of the Canadian Wildlife Federation, North American Wildlife Society, and of the Moncton Naturalists' Club.

Tony LeSauteur, Environmental Protection Services, Quebec government. Mr. LeSauteur is vice-president of the Canadian Nature Federation, and a past president of the Quebec Wildlife Federation. He was the White Owl Conservation Award winner in 1971.

Peter Middleton, Toronto-based consultant in natural resource management and environmental issues. Mr. Middleton is the former executive-director of Pollution Probe at the University of Toronto.

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Norman Pascoe, Montreal. Former environment editor, now assistant city editor of The Montreal Star. Particular interests are air pollution and wildlife.

Bryan Pearson, Frobisher Bay, Baffin Island, merchant and member of the North-West Territorial Council. He is concerned about sanitation in Northern communities, and is seeking to discourage all sport hunting of the polar bear.

Dr. Stuart Peters, a specialist in natural resource management, is a former Deputy Minister of Resources for the Newfoundland government. He was advisor on Science and Technology to the United Nations and special advisor to the President of the Canadian International Development Agency. He is presently with Shaheen Natural Resources Company in St. John's, Newfoundland.
