RESPONSE TO THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF HALTON  
ON THE PETRO-SUN/S.N.C. PROPOSAL FOR A MODEL  
ENERGY FROM WASTE PLANT

THAT the City of Burlington advise the Region of Halton:

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- (1) that the City of Burlington supports a full examination of the Petro-Sun proposal by the Region's Energy from Waste Task Force as soon as possible;
  - (2) and that the City of Burlington has no comments at this time on the comparative costs and benefits of the proposal, on the production of steam versus electricity, or on the Oakville site proposed;
  - (3) and that any role given to the citizens Solid Waste Advisory Committee in the evaluation of the Petro-Sun proposal be minimal, thus leaving primary responsibility for the evaluation and for any ensuing decision with Regional Council and staff;
  - (4) and that to promote or protect any interest the City may have, should the Petro-Sun proposal be implemented by the Region, the City of Burlington intends to rely ultimately on the environmental approval processes provided for in provincial legislation.
