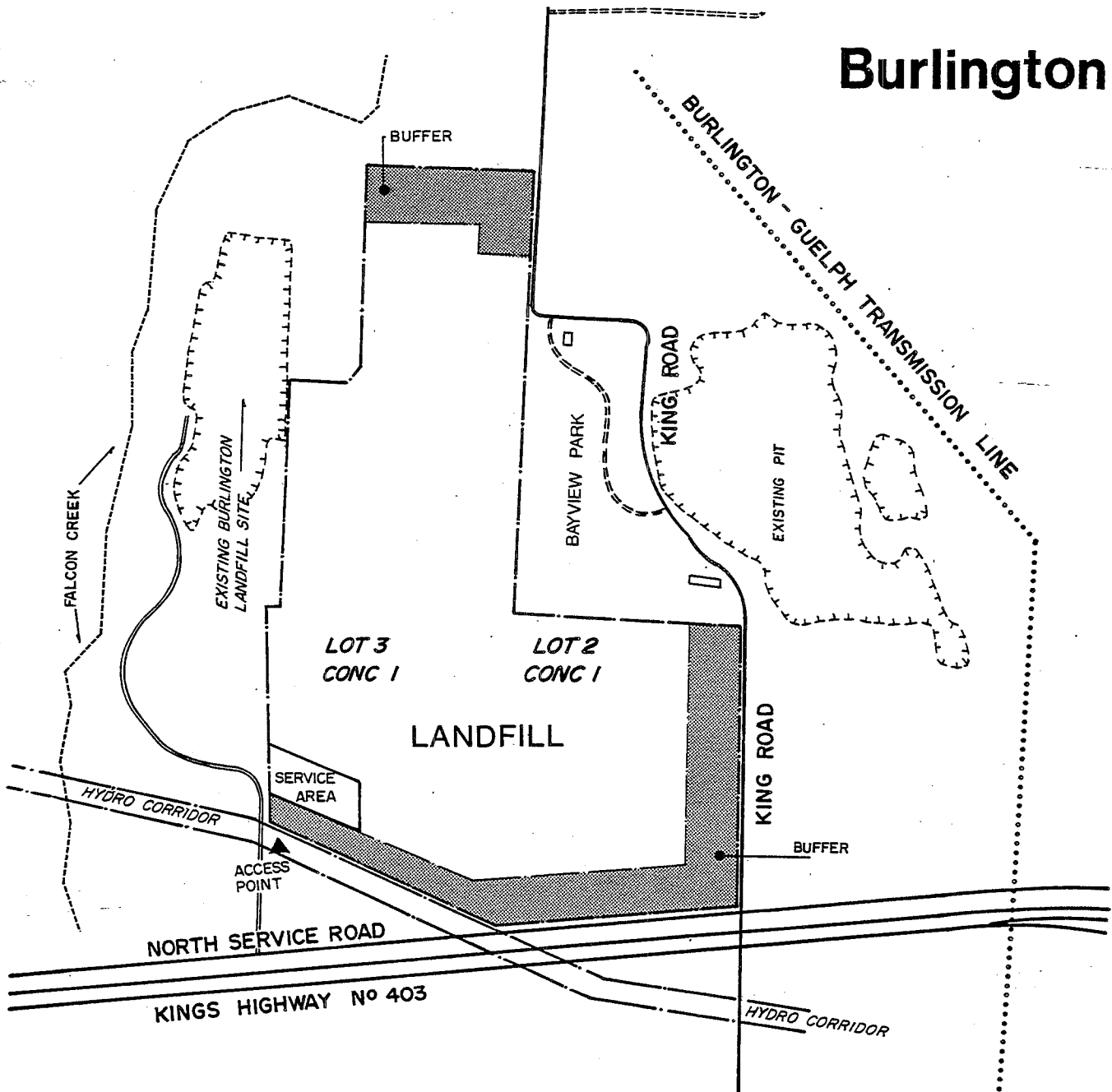
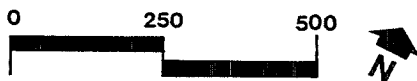

SCALE 1:10 000



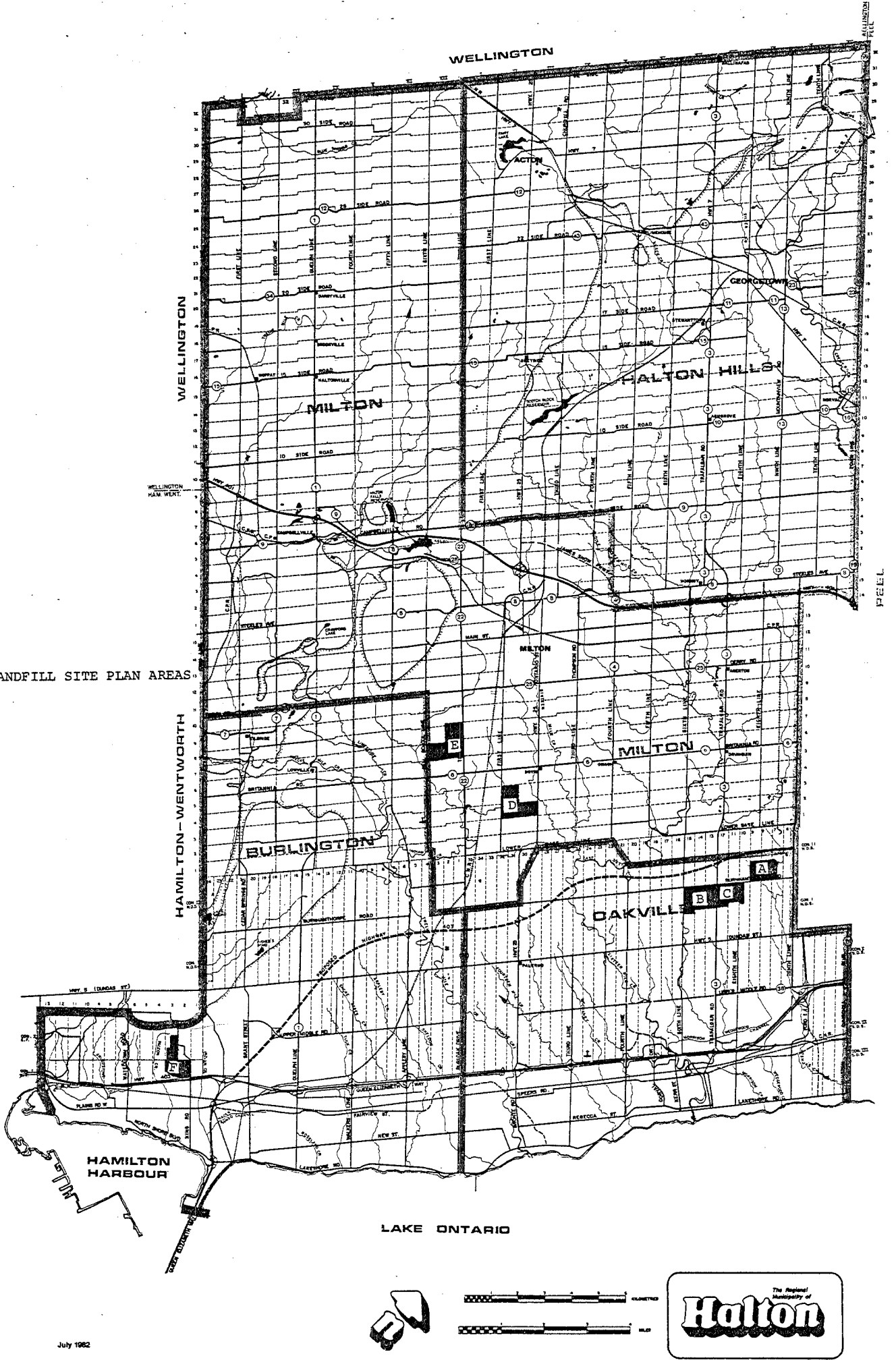
SITE F PHASE 2 STAGE 2 C SELECTION OF PREFERRED SITE

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

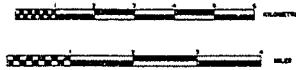

" ATROCIOUS CHOICE OF A LANDFILL SITE "

Another landfill controversy is brewing in Burlington over a proposed site for the garbage from all of the Region of Halton over a period of 20 years.

The Region's environmental consultants have ranked a site in the city as their first choice over five suitable rural sites, although it is close to residential and commercial developments.

West Burlington aldermen and a citizens' group call this ranking atrocious. They feel the Region is looking for the path of the least resistance after it lost the fight for a new landfill in the Milton area and met resistance against an Energy From Waste plant proposed for the Oakville area.

Moreover, the owners of the proposed site have applied to Queen's Park for permits to operate a commercial landfill of their own.

This candidate site lies in Burlington's Aldershot area on the escarpment slope where it faces towards Burlington Bay, north of Hwy. 403. The proposed landfill would deposit 5.6 million tons (5.1 million tonnes) of garbage on 80 hectares (200 acres), rising 15 m (50 ft.) or 6 stories high and stretching from the North service Road to within 600 m (2000 ft.) of the Burlington escarpment.

" BLIGHTED AREA "

An immediate reaction of area residents is surprise and disbelief. They wonder how common sense could arrive at judging this site as the best choice.

They are concerned about the character of this part of the City and how it would be affected by a larger dump. There are neat homes, stores, and churches, a good number of them showcase properties. But the site plan comes to within 1 km (3300 ft.) of fully developed residential areas, even closer to a commercial area. Near this land fill site are the prestige properties of Tridon, CUMIS and the Stelco Research and Development Park.

Certainly the people of Aldershot have reason to be upset. Other parts of Burlington have waged vehement fights to preserve the character of their community against fast food outlets with fears of their traffic noise and litter. But those nuisances pale in comparison to the intensity and reach of the blight that 20 years of nearby landfill operation would create. Better developments with their architecture and landscaping would surely go elsewhere, leaving neglect behind.
