CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

A greater opportunity for the members to have a say in the running of the Conservation Council was one of the objectives of a new constitution approved at the annual general meeting last year. As a result of this both the officers and the members of the board of directors shall be elected by the membership; nominations shall be sought in a call for nominations being mailed to all members; voting shall be by mail ballot prior to the annual meeting; the results of the voting shall be announced at the annual general meeting.

Council President Ken Langmaid has set up the nominations committee of Chapter Presidents: Tim Andrew (Fredericton), Bud Crandall (Saint John), Eric Randall (Woodstock), or their alternates, and a member of Pollution Probe, Moncton. This committee is responsible for the management of the elections.

Nominations can be made through the Chapter Presidents or by using the form below. Nominees should be members in good standing and should, of course, consent to their nomination.

It is necessary to elect the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and the Treasurer and ten directors - eight to serve 1974-1977, and two to serve 1974-1975 to replace directors who have moved from New Brunswick. Present officers and directors are listed below, with those positions open to election this year marked with an asterisk. Chapter Presidents are ex-officio members of the Board.

Annual General Meeting

President's Report

The major newsworthy activity of your executive since the last Newsletter has been the presentation of a brief to the provincial cabinet, which was widely covered in the news media. The brief will be summarized in the report to the AGM.

The executive also issued a fairly detailed news release on the Point Lepreau nuclear generating plant proposal, after careful review of the technical information released to date by the Environment division of the Department of Fisheries and Environment.

As you may know, last April Environment Canada issued a major statement putting forward a plan to undertake impact studies, assessment and public hearings on all major developments which involved federal monies and which might have detrimental effects on the environment. Your executive has requested the Hon. Madame Sauve, newly appointed Minister of the Environment, to implement action on the Lepreau proposal under this plan.

The executive is preparing to present a brief on Land Use to the Legislative Committee on Land Use and Rural Development. This is one of the most important areas of concern in the world today, as the total world food supply related to population is becoming critical, while in developed countries such as Canada the cost of land for housing is rapidly being pushed beyond the reach of the average citizen.

Your Board of Directors is preparing for the Annual General Meeting, planned for Saint John this year - if plans for the speaker are successful this should be a meeting of major importance to the entire population of the area.

Funds are always in short supply, so make sure your own membership is up to date, recruit new members and see if any organizations to which you belong will provide support.
