EXPOSURE: Environmental Links to Breast Cancer and the accompanying guide *Taking Action for a Healthy Future* were conceived in response to the growing public debate about the implications of the contaminated world on our health and the need for educational tools on these issues. They evolved from questions raised by health and environmental researchers that if many cancers are largely environmentally linked, can they therefore be largely preventable? Using popular and adult educational processes, Training Trainers Workshops are designed with and for those interested in helping guide their own group members, colleagues, friends, policy makers, and others in the use of these resources. Designed to meet the specific needs of participants, these workshops are important especially for those for whom the issues are new and or are inexperienced in leading groups themselves. Sessions are organized so that participants can familiarize themselves with the film, develop their skills according to their needs, feel comfortable with the issues, practice in groups (role playing) such as the ones they'll be leading, and therefore develop their knowledge and confidence in ways that will be useful for their ongoing work. Experienced workshop leaders will facilitate this program.
