I support the construction of OPG's Deep Geologic Repository as a safe, permanent plan for low and intermediate level waste from OPG's 20 owned reactors.

I understand the current methods of storing the waste above ground are safe, but placing it 680 metres underground in a low permeability rock formations offers an even safer method of storage.
